# OUR VISION

To be a radiating center for the gospel locally (in San Pedro Sula), regionally (in Honduras) and globally, fulfilling the great commission of Matthew 28:16-20.

## OUR BELIEFS

- 1. We believe in the Bible as the inspired, infallible, authoritative Word of God.
- 2. We believe that there is but one true and living God, who is everlasting, infinite in power, full of love, wisdom and goodness; that He is the creator of all things, visible and invisible. We believe in the Trinity that there are three persons of individual essence, who are co-equal, co-existent and co-eternal namely the Father (Whose name has variously transliterated to English as Yahweh or Jehovah), the Son (Jesus Christ God Incarnate) and the Holy Spirit (the Great Comforter).
- 3. We believe man is a created being, made in the likeness and image of God, but through Adam's transgression and fall sin came into the world. Romans 5:12 (NIV) Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned--
- 4. We believe that Salvation is made possible through the death of Jesus Christ on the cross and His resurrection on the third day. Salvation is the gift of God to man, separate from works, based on grace through faith in Jesus Christ.
- 5. We believe in water baptism by immersion for believers (Matt.28:19). This ordinance is the Christian's identification with Christ and His church.
- 6. We believe the ordinance of The Lord's Supper is a commandment of our Savior; and is a memorial to His death and resurrection.
- 7. We believe in a literal Hell and a literal Heaven-Hell being a place of eternal separation for those that have rejected Jesus Christ as Savior. Heaven is a place of eternal fellowship with God, for the Christian.
- 8. We believe in the imminent coming of our Lord, admonishing us to be watchful. We believe we should live holy lives. This belief motivates us to be urgent and zealous in evangelizing the unsaved.
- 9. International Christian Fellowship believes that The Bible teaches that marriage is the exclusive, covenant relationship between one man and one woman.

## CHURCH OVERVIEW

ICF was founded in 1997. Prior to the Corona virus pandemic, we had approximately 50-60 adult members plus children. The attendance on Sunday mornings was 70–100 including 20–30 children involved in Sunday School or the nursery. As a result of the pandemic, our weekly attendance has declined to about 25 people. The church meets every Sunday afternoon at 2:00 in a borrowed Spanish church building.

The congregation of ICF comes from a wide variety of denominations and church backgrounds. The majority of members are North Americans or Hondurans but we also have members from, El Salvador, the Philippines, Russia, Haiti and other countries. Essentially, most are English-speakers but we have provided a Spanish translation for those that do not speak English. ICF members are educators, business people, missionaries, lawyers, medical professionals, students, and stay-at-home spouses.

# CHURCH STRUCTURE

We have an Elder-led church structure. The pastor also serves as an Elder. The selfsupported pastor receives a stipend to help offset housing expenses.
